Opening hours 2024

- Mondays closed, with exception of 12-2; 19-2; 1-4; 22-4; 29-4; 6-5; 20-5; 8-7; 15-7; 22-7; 29-7; 5-8; 12-8; 19-8; 26-8; 21-10; 28-10; 23-12; 30-12
- Tuesday to Sunday: 10.00 17.00

See and do

- The palace tours (2 x 30 minutes): wander through the rooms where the Dutch royals lived and listen to their stories.
- The exhibition "The House Of Orange-Nassau" (60 minutes): the collection of art and personal objects of the Dutch royals illustrates the personal lives of members of the House of Orange-Nassau.
- The palace garden (60 minutes): a unique 17th century garden with fountains and fragrant flowers.
- The stable yard (30 minutes): a large collection of royal carriages and old-timers in the stables and coach houses.

Group Conditions

- Timely registration of groups is required by email
- Vouchers on invoice by agreement or payment at the ticket office
- Free admission for one tour leader per group of 15 persons
- Parking for buses and minivans free of charge



Reservation of entrance tickets

- Date and arrival time
- Timeslot for palace tour (from about 20 minutes after arrival)
- Number of persons and number of rental audio guide sets

Palace Visit with Audio Guided Tour

- Palace visits always take place via an audio guided tour. Different characters take you
 back in time when the royal residents lived in the palace. In their stories, the palace
 comes to life.
- A rental device costs € 1.50 p.p. if registered in advance or € 2.50 p.p. on site. The audio guided tour is included via the app on the visitor's smartphone. In that case please bring your own headphones.
- Available languages of the audio tour: English, German and Dutch.
- There is a choice of 2 different audio guided tours of approximately 30 minutes each:
 - o The William & Mary tour leads the visitor through the 17th century rooms and shows the life of the first residents William III and Mary Stuart.
 - The House of Wilhelmina tour gives the visitor an insight into the lives of the Dutch Royals who lived at the palace from the 18th till the 20th century.

Group lunch or coffee break

Stable 1 is a unique location for a group lunch or coffee break. The name refers to the stables where the royal horses stood.
